


## ART IN PUBLIC PLACES / COJ PUBLIC ART PROJECT DASHBOARD

Much like Capital Improvement Projects, a public art project encompasses a project scoping/feasibility study, a conceptual design phase, a final design phase, regulatory review processes, fabrication, site work, and installation. A public art project may also experience delays in procurement, fabrication, supply chain issues and the like, just as another construction project may encounter. Some artworks may require a much more extensive design phase due to the project scope and level of stakeholders involved, while other mediums (like murals, for instance) typically have a much more expedient fabrication and installation phase. To that end, a public art project can take anywhere from one to three years to realize regardless of the budget associated with it, as all projects require the same level of care and expertise to ensure what is built can safely co-exist within the public realm.
