- A RESOLUTION OF THE DUVAL COUNTY COURTHOUSE PLAZA ART PROJECT ART SELECTION PANEL ("ASP") [APPROVING] [RECOMMENDING FURTHER REVISION TO AND RETURN THE **ASP OF||TERMINATING** TO NEGOTIATIONS RELATED TOl THE FINAL PACKAGE FOR ARTWORK TITLED "THESE VOICES OF JACKSONVILLE", AS SET FORTH IN EXHIBIT 'A'.
- **WHEREAS**, pursuant to Section 126.906, Ordinance Code, the Art in Public Places Committee formed the ASP to make recommendations to the Committee on the selection of public art for the Duval County Courthouse Plaza (the "Project");
- WHEREAS, Cliff Garten Studio was one of the finalists for the Project and presented a conceptual design to the ASP that was to include text onto the face of its proposed artwork (the "Artwork") for the Project, which conceptual design provided that such Artwork text was to be approved by the City before integration into the Project.
- **WHEREAS,** on May 21, 2021, the ASP recommended that Cliff Garten Studio be awarded the public art contract for the Project based on the conceptual design, subject to future approval by the ASP of the Artwork text;
- **WHEREAS**, the funding and placement of the Project on the Duval County Courthouse Plaza is intended to be a form of government speech, and it is the intention of the ASP for the Artwork text to present the image that the City wishes to project to visitors to the Duval County Courthouse;
- **WHEREAS,** on August 23, 2022, the ASP reconvened to review Cliff Garten Studio's draft of the proposed Artwork text, and during that meeting the ASP declined to approve such text and requested Cliff Garten Studio to revise the Artwork text in accordance with ASP instructions;
- **WHEREAS**, on February 7, 2023, the ASP reconvened to review Cliff Garten Studio's revised proposed Artwork text, and during that meeting the ASP declined to approve the minor revisions to the proposed Artwork text as presented and requested Cliff Garten Studio to revise the Artwork text in accordance with further ASP instructions;
- **WHEREAS**, the Cliff Garten Studio has revised and resubmitted the proposed Artwork text, which is attached **Exhibit "A"** to this Resolution.
- **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Duval County Courthouse Art Project Art Selection Panel:
 - **Section 1**. The recitals set forth above are true and correct and are hereby incorporated

herein by this reference.

Section 2. (Version 1). The ASP hereby approves the substance and placement of the Artwork text as set forth in **Exhibit "A"** attached hereto and requests final approval by the Art in Public Places Committee; provided that the Executive Director ("Executive Director") of the Cultural Council of Greater Jacksonville (the "Cultural Council") is hereby authorized to administratively approve grammatical or other typographical errors to the Artwork text (but not any other changes to content or placement of any Artwork text). The ASP confirms that the shape and dimensions of the overall Project are hereby approved provided that the Executive Director is hereby authorized to approve minor structural modifications of the Project based upon final engineering of the Project.

The following is the text that will appear on the sculpture. Since it takes days to lay out the text, the previous version appears in the images of the text layout on the sculpture in this submission. (See, 230223_These Truths_TextLayout.pdf) The look is basically the same. The text on the sculpture will be revised to what is approved by the ASP.

The four sides of the sculpture are designated by the key words Justice, facing the street, Freedom facing the Courthouse, Equality facing the street, Equity facing the Courthouse. The five parts of each sculpture are the Scroll, Foyer, Lightbox, Back Porch, and Tail. The following texts correspond to each of these areas and are clearly labeled in the images of the pdf.
