**Draft Motion, June 2, 2020**  
**The Duval County Courthouse Art in Public Places Project**

Whereas the Art in Public Places ordinance resulted in a \$619,000 set aside for public art from the construction of the Duval County Courthouse;

Whereas the Art in Public Places Committee with the management of the Cultural Council of Greater Jacksonville established the Duval County Courthouse Plaza Stakeholder Committee to prepare a proposal for public art at the Courthouse;

Whereas the Stakeholder Committee met four times in 2020 and engaged the community with surveys, public presentations, online presentations and design charrette with a total of more than 500 people, and,

Therefore, the Duval County Courthouse Plaza Stakeholders recommend the following to the Art in Public Places Committee;

The purpose of the public art project for the Duval County Courthouse will be the transformation of the 3 acre exterior plaza into a work of public art that becomes a safe active urban park with multiple spaces for small events, free speech and sculptures. The entire plaza will be a dignified, memorable and iconic work of art with artist-designed elements such as earth-berms, pathways, bollards, shade structures and lighting.

The APP Committee should appoint an Artist Selection Panel to select and pay three artist-led teams to develop plaza proposals for the immediate use of \$500,000 and additional ideas for future enhancements that address the objectives revealed through the community engagement by the Stakeholder Committee in 2020;

The Artist Selection Panel should reach out across North America to discover the artists-led teams and coordinate their understanding of the civic, cultural, security, maintenance and future roadway needs of the City, Courthouse and Plaza during the proposal process;

The Artist Selection Panel should engage a broad community in a discussion of the plaza proposals prior to the final selection;

The APP Committee and the Cultural Council should strive to select a design by March 2021 and complete the transformation by summer of 2022; and

If additional funding, grants or donations become available, the City and/or Cultural Council should secure the funding to enhance the transformation of the plaza.
